God worked out things in amazing ways. My car was sold for a good price a week before I went back to Trinidad. God also sent several people who truly were blessings to me during this time. Pastor Joseph from Amazing Grace Fundamental Baptist Church, the first church I served in Trinidad, along with his wife, Cassil, and Denver came after work several times to help me pack. Without them it was almost impossible for me to take down the heavy bookshelves and bedframe and wrap them up. They also tried so hard to sell the things I planned not to bring with me. Thank God for these servants of Him.

God's timing is always perfect. Besides in Trinidad, God again sent wonderful people to help me in Grenada. I reserved space for eight pallets on the boat, and the shipping fee I paid included the labor to put all small packages on the pallets. For whatever reason the boatman did not do his work. As a result the number of my belongings (124 pks) did not match what was on the custom declaration form (8 pallets). The officer requested me to open each single package. Thank God the boat arrived in Grenada six hours later than it was scheduled. Brother Childers could not pick up my stuff till December 11, the day I flew to Grenada, or he wouldn't have been able to answer all the questions the custom officer had.



Anything else besides books, craft material and stationary? After seeing 30 some boxes, the officer realized most of my stuff was for the ministry. He then just took a glimpse of the other packages. I was exhausted at that time but thankful it was done. Brother Childers organized a group of six men from church to help load up the truck. They also carried everything into my apartment and set up the bedframe so that I could rest. All I could say is God is good and always! Thank God for His goodness and faithfulness.
