Thank you so much for your prayers and faithful support of our ministry. We wanted to send you this update to let you know what God is doing through your labor in Korea to His glory and for His kingdom.

**Increased attendance** - Over the past several months, we have seen our attendance grow from 24 to 30 people. This includes four young adults, one family with two small children and visitors on a fairly regular bases.

### **New Ministries -**

**New Bible Study** - On Sunday afternoon at 1:30, our deacon, Brother Young-Bo, leads an English Bible Study

**Cambodian Outreach** - On Sunday afternoon from 2:30-4:30, we have a class to learn the Cambodian language. (You can view a video with more information about this ministry [here](#).)

**Ladies Class** - On Tuesday night, Rachael leads a ladies' English class and Bible study.

**Bible Institute** - On Thursday night, I teach the Apologia Bible Institute Class.

### **Spiritual Growth -**

Each week, I have one-on-one Bible studies with two of the young men who have started coming to our church. Ho-min recently trusted Christ and was baptized. He is an eager, new Christian, who loves to read the Word and wants to obey God. Two weeks ago, he did not come to church on Sunday. Monday, at our Bible study, I asked him why he did not come. He said, "I am sorry, Pastor. I had dinner with my friend last night at midnight and didn't get to bed until 3 a.m." I was about to say something about priorities and time management, but then he continued, "His parents are Catholic, and he claims no religion, so I was able to have dinner with him and share the Gospel" So, I quickly changed course and said, "Good job."

Sung-min, our other young adult man, said he was saved years ago but now wants to get serious about his faith. He seems to be growing little by little and has agreed to be baptized next week.

We are also seeing signs of spiritual growth in many of our church folks.

On the home front, things continue to go well. Rachael and I just celebrated our 14th wedding anniversary. We were able to enjoy a nice evening out at a steak restaurant and coffee shop. We returned home and the kids had cleaned the kitchen and made a special homemade presents for us.

We began the new home schooling year in late February. God has blessed, and everything is going well. Please pray for Rachael and the kids, that they will be able to have a successful year by God's grace.
